WHEREAS, Drowning Impact Awareness Month raises awareness that the number and impact of child drownings in Arizona affects everyone; and

WHEREAS, each year, drowning incidents in Arizona take the lives of the equivalent of a classroom of children; and

WHEREAS, any family can lose their child to drowning, regardless of the family's education, race or socio-economic background; and

WHEREAS, families can take simple steps to protect their children near water to avoid such a tragic and unnecessary loss of life; and
